What is the Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium?

The Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium (TCMHCC) addresses mental health challenges and aims to improve the mental healthcare system for children and adolescents in Texas.

Trauma in Children and Adolescents

- Children and adolescents who have experienced a frightening or stressful event can develop reactions that affect their daily lives after the events have ended.
- Traumatic reactions can include a variety of emotional, behavioral, and physical responses.
- Some examples include: depressive symptoms or anxiety, difficulty sleeping and eating, nightmares, and risky behavior.

CTRN Study Aims

- The Childhood Trauma Research Network (CTRN) aims to gather information from youth and their caregivers to better understand how to measure, treat and prevent the lasting effects of trauma in youth.
- The information gathered will help clinicians and educators to provide more informed education and treatment to youth, parents and families.

Inclusion Criteria

- Children, adolescents and young adults who have a history of trauma exposure
- Are 8 to 20 years old
- Are English and/or Spanish speakers
- Are willing to dedicate their time to attending research visits
